


All the songs in this book are for research and personal use only.





There are four sizes of ukulele: Soprano (smallest), Concert, Tenor, Baritone (largest). Standard gcea tuning is suitable for sopranos, concerts and tenors. Most people start learning on a soprano, but people with large fingers may prefer a Concert or Tenor ukulele with a wider fret board. I would not recommend a Baritone for a beginner as they are tuned DGBE and use different chord shapes, that are not covered by this course.





Holding Your Ukulele

It's important you hold your ukulele correctly. Your dominant hand will be used to strum and your non-dominant will hold down the strings to form chords. Sit upright in a comfortable position with both feet flat on the floor. The fret board should be facing away from your body. When sitting you can rest the body of the ukulele on your leg leaving your strumming hand free to move. Alternatively hold your ukulele higher, supported between your forearm and chest.

Things to watch out for:

1. When I play a chord, are all the strings ringing out? Try this for all the chords you play and make sure all 4 stings are ringing out clearly.

2. When I change chords is it smooth with both chords being clear?

3. Am I playing the right chord in the right place? In a song you must change chords, it is easy to change early or late, listen to make sure you change in the right place.

Tuning your ukulele

The first thing to do before playing is to tune your ukulele. A new instrument will take a lot of tuning as the strings will be slack and they will take a while to bed in. The easiest way is to buy a "clip on tuner", costing between $\pounds 6.00$ and $\pounds 12.00$.

Left-Handed Players. Ukuleles usually come tuned for a right-handed player. Lefthanded players will have to have the instrument re-strung in reverse order. A Chord chart for left handers is shown at the end. An alternative is to try playing right-handed.






Strumming

Strumming is the main technique with the ukulele and just covered in this book. Strumming is used to provide a rhythm for songs. Use the index finger to strum down and up on the strings to produce a chord.

Strumming with your fingers

You need to hold your hand up as if to wave, spread your fingers (1) and point with your index finger (2). Now strum with your first finger. The thumb can also be held against the finger for support. Remember to strum gently, using the wrist to flex up and down.



Chord Boxes

Chord boxes are used to display the finger positions used to make a chord. Each vertical line represents the strings, numbered 1 to 4. The horizontal lines represent the metal frets down the ukulele neck.

The majority of popular songs are based on a 4/4 rhythm, that is four beats to the bar. Your first strumming pattern is playing four strokes down, counting: 1 2 3 4. Start slowly and evenly. Let the forearm move down and up, allow the wrist to rotate and brush the finger over the strings.

This open chord is C6, but can also be called Am7 (A minor 7).

Second, and a more common strumming pattern adds an up stroke, still with 4 beats to the bar, but counting: 1 & 2 & 3 & 4 &. The 1 to 4 being the down strum, the & being the up strum. Again, start slowly and evenly, letting the finger brush down and up over the strings, trying not to pluck the string. Stop and start again with a faster tempo, keeping it even.

Chords are made by pressing the strings down to change the note of the strings. Cup your hand around the neck and bend your fingers to be able to press down on the strings. Press down with the tips of your fingers, nails short help. Make sure you press between the frets. Pressing on a fret will produce a dead sound. Start strumming with the chord of C, as shown in the diagram. The black dot shows the string and fret position to be

held down. Use your third finger to press down between the second and third fret. Numbers are placed at the bottom of the diagram to show which fingers to use. Practice strumming using the chord of C as below.

We now introduce the chord of G7 and use your fingers as shown. Finger one (Index finger) goes on first fret, second string. Finger two goes on second fret, third string. Then tuck your third finger under your second finger on fret two, first string. Pluck each string to make sure they all ring out, before strumming. When comfortable with this chord, practice changing from G7 to C and back again.

The next strumming practice involves the two chords. Start slowly until you can play without a break between chord changes, before speeding up.

When you start strumming, you will want to look down at your hand to make sure your fingers are in the right place. This is normal, so don't worry, and with practice your fingers will find there way without you having to look.









Points to Remember.

- 1. Use the wrist to strum, keep it loose.
- 2. Use your finger tips to press down strings for chords.
- 3. Posture. Sit up straight so you can hold your ukulele without bending your wrist to hold chords.
- 4. Daily Practice. A few minutes each day is much better than just 30 minutes once a week.

All the songs are attached below and can be practised at home. Look at the chord shapes and practice changing from one to another before playing the song. Start slowly and tap your foot to help keep the beat. The music contains the words with the chord name interspersed in square brackets. Keep playing the chord until you reach the next chord and change. All the songs are taken from the group's song books.

1 Jambalaya

We can now play our first song, Jambalaya, just using the chords of C and G7, as practiced above. There is an intro of each chords played with 4 beats, strummed up and down and the last chord with an arrow indicating a single down strum and stop. You then start singing and resume stumming at the first chord.

2 Amazing Grace

The introduction of the chord F. Most songs are in 4/4 time, that is 4 beats to the bar, but this song is in 3/4 time, Waltz time, counting 1&2&3& for each bar. Practice the following changes: C to F to G7 and back to the start. Then try playing Amazing Grace.

The chords C F and G7 are the most common chords you will play and give you lots of songs to enjoy. The colons : are repeat marks.

3 King of the Road

The same three chords of C, F and G7. This song is in 4/4 time with quicker chord changes. Play slowly to start, strumming up and down, getting use to changing chords and gradually increase the tempo. Try changing the strumming rhythm to a shuffle by extending the down strum and shortening the up strum; dum de dum de dum de dum.

4 In the Summertime

Another song using the three chords: C F and G7



5 I Have a Dream

This song, with the three main chords, is nice and slow, but has a different strumming pattern of: |D DUDUD |D DUDUD |. This pattern leaves out two up strums, where your hand will still go up, but not touch the strings.

6 When the Saints

A nice lively song to play with our three main chords, plus C7.

7 Leaving on a Jet plane

A well know song by John Denver and a 1960's hit for Peter, Paul and Mary. This introduces the chord of Dm, (D minor). Before playing the song, practice playing the four chords to get used to the changes.

8 Let's Dance

This song uses the chord of G together with C and F. Notice the finger positions numbered under the box. The chord of G can take a little time to get used to.

9 Que Sera Sera

This song has three beats to the bar and contains all the chords we have used up-to-now. Strum:- DUDUDU and count – 1&2&3&

10 Stand by me

We introduce the chord of Am, (A minor), together with C F and G7. It has 4 beats to the bar, but has a different Strumming pattern of: D DU UDU

11 Dirty Old Town

No new chords in this song, just practice with C F Dm and Am. There is a kazoo introduction and solo, but you can just hum these parts. The start has [NC] meaning no chords, so just hum and start strumming at the first chord. Also stop stumming at the end of the intro. The strumming is straight up and down.

12 Beautiful Sunday

Together with C and G, we now have the chords of A and D. The intro. Is 4 beats for each chord, strumming up and down. When a chord is shown, $[D\downarrow]$, you play a single down strum and stop until the next chord.

13 Sailor

Now we have our first bar chord, where your first finger lays across all the strings on the second fret holding them down. Your second or third finger, whichever is more comfortable, holds down the first sting on the third fret. To hold a bar chord, you will need to move

your hand round with your thumb at the back of the neck. This allows you to press the first finger down on the strings.

14 Oh What a Beautiful Morning

This song from Oklahoma is in three time and gives more practice with D7.

15 Sway

A song with a Latin feel and a strumming pattern of: D DU UDU. This song has the chord of Bb, (B flat). This is a difficult chord with the first finger holding down the bottom two string and the second and third fingers spread across. It needs to be practiced as Bb is in many of our songs.

16 Happy Together

Another lively song from the 1960's. No new chords, but chance to practice the chords with a new song.

17 The Loc-Motion

A fun song you can sing on your own to practice Bb and also Gm. Strum up and down, slowly to start practicing the chord changes.

18 Island of Dreams and Morning Town Ride.

A medley of two songs joined together without a break. There are a number of different chords, including Em. When you see the word Chorus, you go back, repeat the chorus, and go to the next verse.

19 The Letter

This song has the chord of E7 together with other common chords. It's quite a short song so repeated.

20 A Hard Day's Night

One last chord of F7 and one where you use all four fingers. This chord is played after the chord of C. Use your little finger to play C and keep it there to make it much easier to then play the F7. There is a single chord played at the start and that is the C7sus4, a rare chord to play. Play the initial chord, count 1 2 3 and start the song, only strumming when you get to the C chord. There are more chords to learn, but this course will give you a good start.
